GUEST SPEAKER: Paul Vance, Connecticut State Trooper—
Yes, state troopers hand out tickets... they also have complex crime investigation units (major crime squad, narcotics, etc.) The CT State Trooper force us the 3rd largest in New England, below the Boston City Police and Massachusetts State Troopers. There are 1250 troopers and 62 recruits that will graduate in April.
